More manners than most humans.

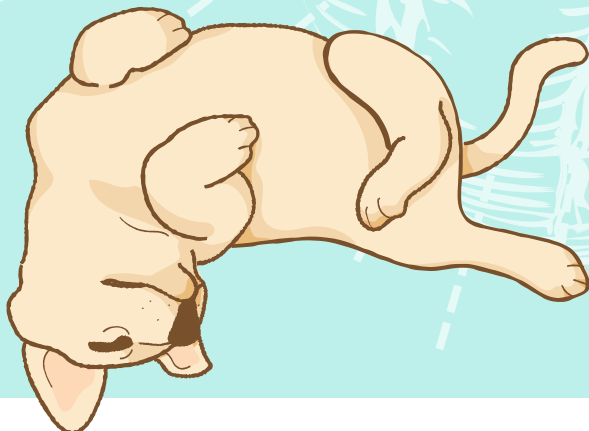
